

Talking about other people in Japanese



おかあさんのなまえは M a r g e です。

Okaasan no namae wa Marge desu



おかあさんは 34 さい です。

Okaasan wa 34 sai desu



おかあさんは ねこ が すき です。

Okaasan wa neko ga suki desu

Because Bart has already mentioned his mother in his first sentence, he doesn't need to repeat it over and over. Unlike English where we need to put the subject (or a pronoun like 'she') in every sentence, in Japanese you don't need to. That means that we don't need to include the underlined parts in our introduction.
